DAY 1 AIZWAL ARRIVAL



OVERNIGHT : AIZAWL (MIZORAM)

Aizwal is home to the Mizoram State Museum, along with being the cultural and religious capital of the Mizos. Among one of the oldest cities in the north eastern region of India, with an elevated setting and breathtaking views, Aizawl is a peaceful little town even though it's the capital of the state. It would be probably one of the most peaceful state capitals in India. Aizawl, pronounced eyezole, is a perfect place to relax while enjoying the local food and culture. Home to the Mizoram State Museum and few other tourist complexes, tourists have few options to enjoy a sightseeing tour in the city.

On arrival transfer to hotel. Overnight at Aizwal.

DAY 2 AIZWAL SIGHTSEEING



OVERNIGHT : AIZAWL (MIZORAM)

After breakfast proceed for sightseeing of Aizwal town which will include the visit of State Museum. Museum is situated at Mc Donald Hill in the town center. Open Monday - Friday from 9:00 A.M to 5 PM. Saturday 9 AM to 1 PM. Though small, it has an interesting collection of historical relics, ancient costumes and traditional implements. Falkawn village A model village depicting the lifestyle of the Mizo people, Falkawn village is a unique cultural extravaganza for first time visitors to Mizoram. Falkawn village depicts the livelihoods and cultures of the Mizo people, who form the biggest tribe of the state. Located 22 km away from the capital city of Aizawl Falkawn village is a unique concept and an effort to provide people with an insight into one of the greatest tribal cultures of our land. Reiek, At 1600 meters, Reiek Tlang is one of the highest hills of Mizoram. A place to find peace and serenity, Reiek Tlang calls out to the lovers of nature, adventure and romance. Located at a distance of 29 km away from the city of Aizawl, Reiek Tlang provides its visitors with an opportunity for trekking with the backdrop of sceneries borrowed from the Mizo Hills. As is the case with most North Eastern destination of India, Reiek is also relatively unexplored and sits pretty as a pearl in the hills. Dampa Tigar Forest, Dampa Tiger Reserve, a splendid Wildlife Sanctuary, is located amidst the deep and dense forests of Mizoram in India. The forests are located about 125 kilometres from Aizawl and are rich with a variety of flora and fauna that draw tourists and nature lovers to the Northeastern state of India from all parts of the world. The name Dampa was derived from the lonely bachelors (Dam Pa meaning Lonely Men) left in the region after the passing of a majority of the female population. The Dampa wildlife sanctuary covers a sprawling area of over 500 square kilometres on the western side of Mizoram and touches the international boundaries of Bangladesh.

DAY 3 TRANSFER AIZWAL - SILCHAR (120KM/6HRS)



OVERNIGHT : SILCHAR (ASSAM)

Have early morning breakfast, checkout from the hotel and proceed for **Silchar** Silchar which is a transit point for entering Agartala. Silchar Situated on the Surma (Barak) River, and known for its scenic beauty and natural splendor, Silchar is surrounded by Manipur on the east, Bangladesh on the west, Mizoram on the south and the Barail hills on the north. Due to its picturesque location, Silchar is also used as the gateway to the neighbouring areas of Manipur and Mizoram.

On arrival Silchar, will visit **Khaspur** Here you can find the ruins of a great Dimasa kingdom. The main attractions are the Lion Gate, the Sun Gate and aged old kings temple. The original palace is in a state of non-existence, but its subsidiaries, the main entrance gate, the `Suryadwar`, `Debalaya` are still there intact. The entrances are of elephant-patterns.

Then visit **Dolu Lake** One of the most beautiful lake in Silchar and a photographer's delight, this lake is a peaceful spot to spend some quality time. **Badarpur Fort** The Badarpur fort situated on the bank of Barak River is an important historic place of Barak valley. The Fort is about 16 km away from Badarpur Railway station.

Evening check in to hotel. Overnight at Silchar

DAY 4 TRANSFER SILCHAR - AGARTALA (280KM / 8HRS)



OVERNIGHT : AGARTALA (TRIPURA)

After early morning breakfast proceed for Agartala. Silchar to Agartala total distance of approx. 280km will be covered in almost 8 hours.

Agaratala : Home to the Manikya Kings in the past, Agartala is the perfect mix of natural beauty combined with diverse and rich culture. Agartala is not just all flowers and valleys but also has a cultural richness with the diversity of people that stay here along with the historical and religious monuments. The capital of Tripura manages to create its culture and personality out of the coming together of stories of all those who reside here and give it a hue of their own culture.

On arrival Agartala, check in to Agartala Hotel Note : You can also take flight from Silchar to Agartala

DAY 5 AGARTALA SIGHTSEEING



OVERNIGHT : AGARTALA (TRIPURA)

After breakfast proceed for Agartala local sightseeing. Visiting Ujjayanta Palace, Ujjayanta Palace was a royal palace. Situated at the core of Agartala, the entire hustle-bustle of the city is centered around this palace. Built in 1901, it has magnificent tiled floors, curved wooden ceilings and lovely doors. The name 'Ujjayanta Palace' was given by Rabindranath Tagore, a regular visitor of Tripura. The State has owns a lineage of an independent royal state. The Palace stands on the banks of a small lake surrounded by the lush greenery of Mughal gardens in Agartala. Spread over an expanse of 28 hectares of parkland, this exotic palace has several Hindu temples dedicated to the deities. Lakshmi Narayan, Uma-Maheshwari, Kali and Jagannath. One of the largest museums in Northeast India, covering an area over 800 acres of land in the capital city it depicts the lifestyle, art, culture, tradition and utility crafts, beside the customs and practices of various communities residing in northeast India Sepahjala Wildlife Sanctury More than 150 species of residential birds, migratory birds, orchid garden, boating facilities, wild life, botanical garden, zoo, elephant joy-rides, rubber and coffee plantations beckon the tourists all through the year. The added visual incentive for animallovers is the famous spectacled monkey which is now a rare species. This place is not just a wildlife sanctuary but also an academic and research centre. Various lakes are present within the sanctuary, where boating facility is available. Neermahal The Lake Palace of Tripura' or the Neermahal is the largest palace of its kind in the entire Indian Subcontinent. This architectural beauty rightly derives its name from its location, i.e. the middle of Rudrasagar Lake. It is one of the two water palaces that our country has. The former royal palace is an outcome of King Bir Bikram Kishore Manikya Bahadur's great perspective. It was the summer palace for king and his family. Even today, its highly ornated structure showcases the glorious past. The surrounding lawns and flower beds add seven stars to the beauty of this place. Tripura Sundari Templeis a beautiful temple situated in Udaipur, around 55 km away from Agartala, Tripura. This opulent temple is 500 years old thereby making it the oldest temple present in the Udaipur district. Tripura Sundari Temple is one of the 51 Sakti Peethas and is the place where the toe of the right foot of Sati fell. Owing to its history and beauty, this majestic temple remains flooded by tourists all through the year. Overnight at Agartala Hotel

DAY 6 FLIGHT AGARTALA TO IMPHAL



OVERNIGHT : IMPHAL (MANIPUR)

After breakfast checkout from hotel and transfer to Agartala Airport. Take a flight to Imphal. **Imphal :** Imphal has a untouched charm surrounding its natural beauty, sceneries and landscapes as well as a significant history leaving hints of the past around the city. The lust green landscapes, beautiful surroundings, unexplored territories and undulating rivers of Imphal make for a great tourist destination. This site of the battle of Imphal during the World War II, assumes a certain importance, derived from history

On arrival check in at Hotel. After lunch visit Kangla fort and Ima Market. Overnight Imphal.



OVERNIGHT : IMPHAL (MANIPUR)

Today after breakfast proceed for local sightseeing . Start with Govindjee Temple, Situated near the royal palace. It is dedicated to Shree Govindajee along with various other Hindu Gods and Goddesses viz Krishna, Balaram, Jagannath, Subhadra etc.Loktak lake The largest fresh water lake in the country, Loktak Lake and the Sendra Island on it, are one of the most beautiful attractions of the state. Situated about 50 km from Imphal, Loktak Lake is situated in the valley of Imphal and is home to all the rivers and rivulets that run in the state of Manipur.Loktak Lake and Sendra Island present a combination of beauty unmatched anywhere else in the country. One is the largest freshwater lake in India while the other a floating island made of organic waste on the very same lake, housing the only tourist home in the area. The Lake consist within itself many other floating islands which sustain fishermen villages and are also made of organic waste. The pristine water, the labyrinth of boat routes, the greenery of the surroundings and the riveting crimson sunset, provide one a mesmerizing site. Loktak Lake and Sendra Island are treasures of a dynamic ecosystem and demand protection and preservation. In recent years human encroachment has led to shrinkage of the lake. INA Memorial Once used as the unofficial headquarters of the Indian National Army, this memorial was built to honour the soldiers who had sacrificed their lives for India. Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose motivated and formed armies here to participate in the freedom struggle. Indian tri color was first hoisted here by Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose's Indian National Army. Shaheed Minar This 11 m tall tower is situated in the centre of the Bir Tirkendraiit Park and is a memorial for those who died against the British while fighting in the Meitei Revolt in 1891. Kangla Fort Also known as the Palace of Kangla, this place situated on the banks of the Imphal river, served as the royal palace of King Pakhangba. After 2003 this fort has been open for public viewing. It has historical as well as archaeological significance which makes it a great tourist attraction. Evening back to hotel.

DAY 8 TRANSFER IMPHAL - KOHIMA (140KM / 5 HRS)



OVERNIGHT : KOHIMA (NAGALAND)

Early morning breakfast, check out from hotel and proceed for **Kohima.** "When you go home, tell them of us: that for their tomorrow, we gave our today," reads an epitaph in the War Cemetery of Kohima. This picturesque town is the home of the brave and daring, yet simple and innocent, Naga tribes. Lapped in the eastern frontiers of the Himalayan mountain range, Kohima is marked by an unhurried pace of life, calm and serene environs and fresh, unpolluted air, which make a welcome change for a jaded city dweller. A typical Naga town, it depicts the exotic tribal culture of the northeast and offers a panoramic view of the neighboring hills.

Enroute visit **Heritage village**- a model village for all the major tribes of Nagaland. On arrival check in at Hotel. After lunch visit 2nd **World War Cemetery**. This is, perhaps, one place in Kohima you wouldn't want to miss at all. This beautiful site is dedicated to the 10,000 Allied soldiers who lost their lives during the Japanese invasion during the World War-II.

The cemetery is well kept with lush green, mowed lawns and well groomed flowers. The epitaph on the cemetery wall reads ? When you go home, tell them of us and say That for their tomorrow, we gave our today.....? On the 18 plots of the cemetery, there are 1421 slabs erected in memory of soldiers who were killed in the battle of Kohima. The soldiers were from UK, Japan, East and West Africa and Burma

DAY 9 KOHIMA – KHONOMA SIGHTSEEING




OVERNIGHT : KOHIMA (NAGALAND)

The villagers fought a pitched battle against the British who came on an expedition to the Naga Hills in Oct of 1879. The terraced fields on the slopes near the village provide a delightful view. The village is also known for its artisans and craftsmen. Spend the day interacting with the villagers. We take a delightful walk to Khonoma village from the main gate. Take a tour of the village after lunch and feel the history come to life. Evening back to Kohima Hotel.
